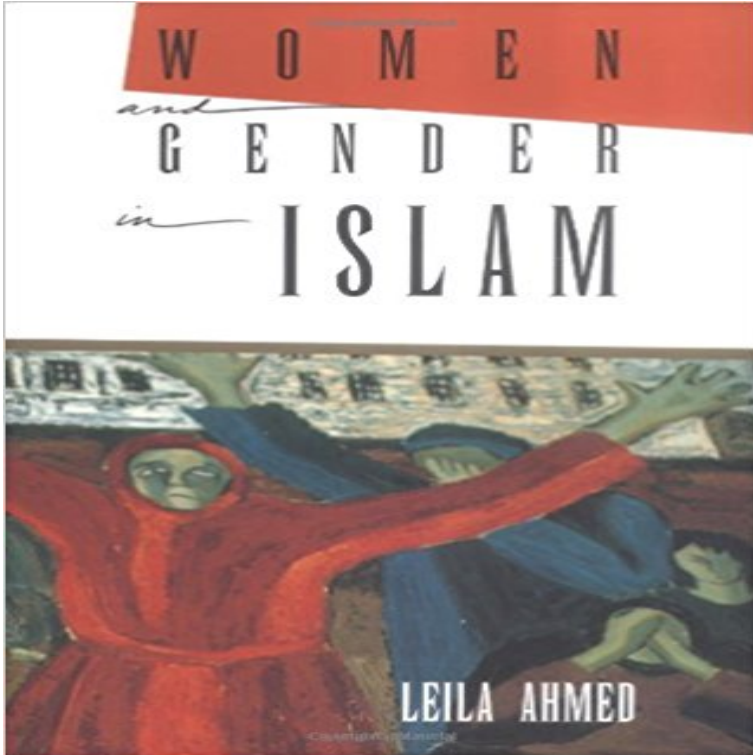


# Women and Gender in Islam: Historical Roots of a Modern Debate
