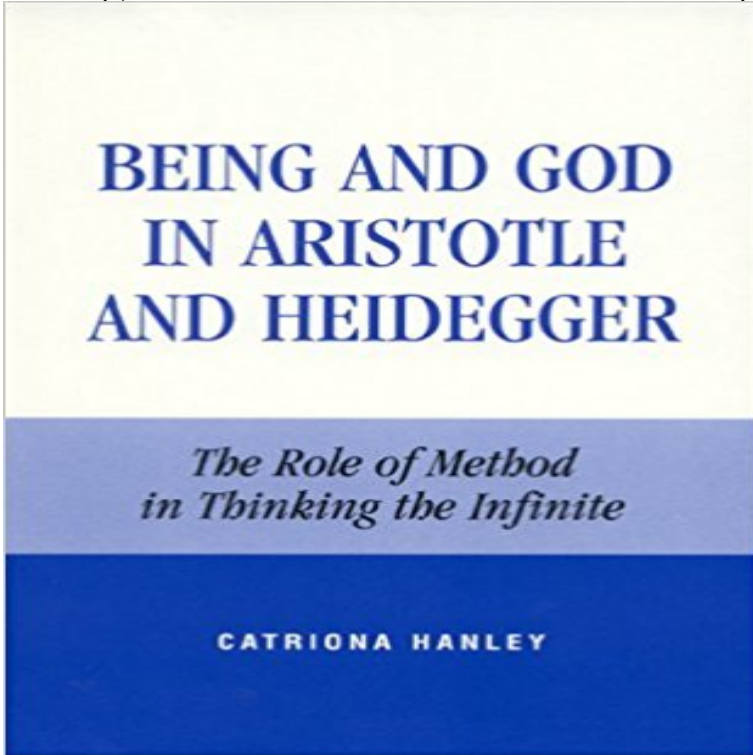


Being and God in Aristotle and Heidegger
