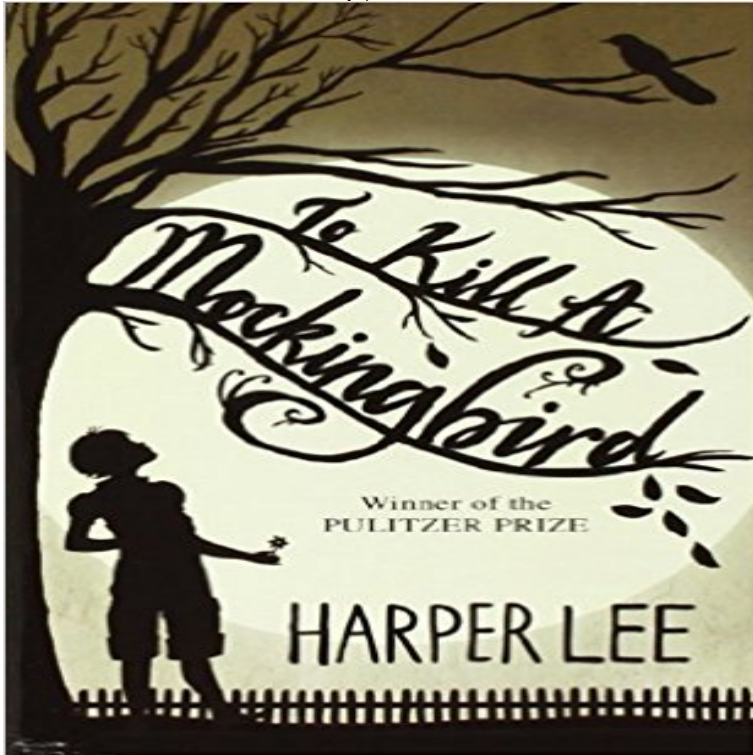


To Kill a Mockingbird
