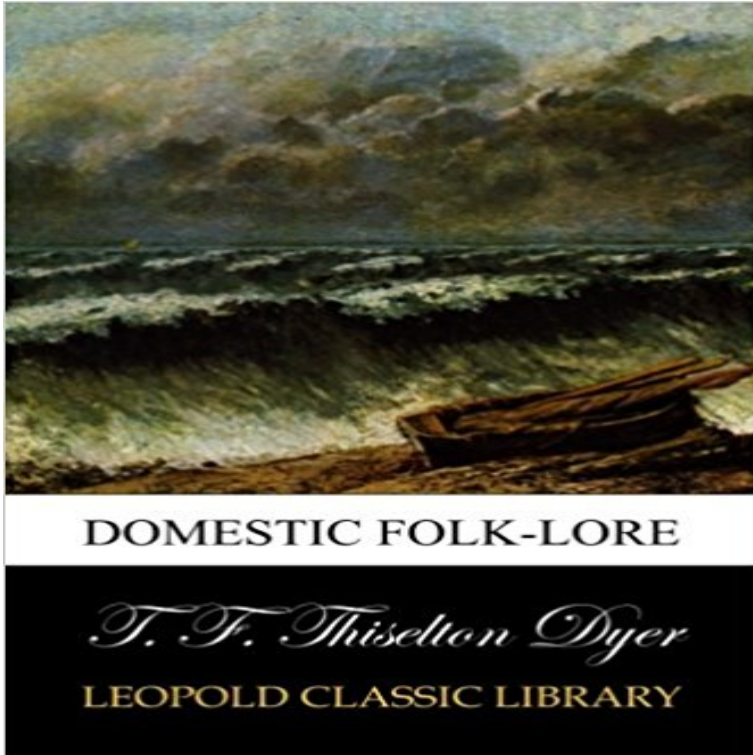


Domestic folk-lore
