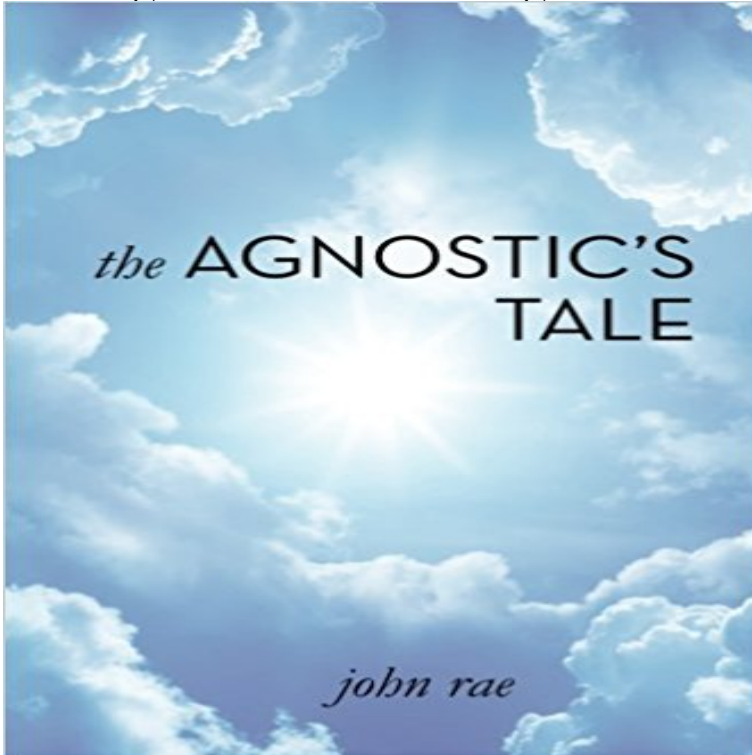


# The Agnostics Tale: A Fragment of Autobiography
