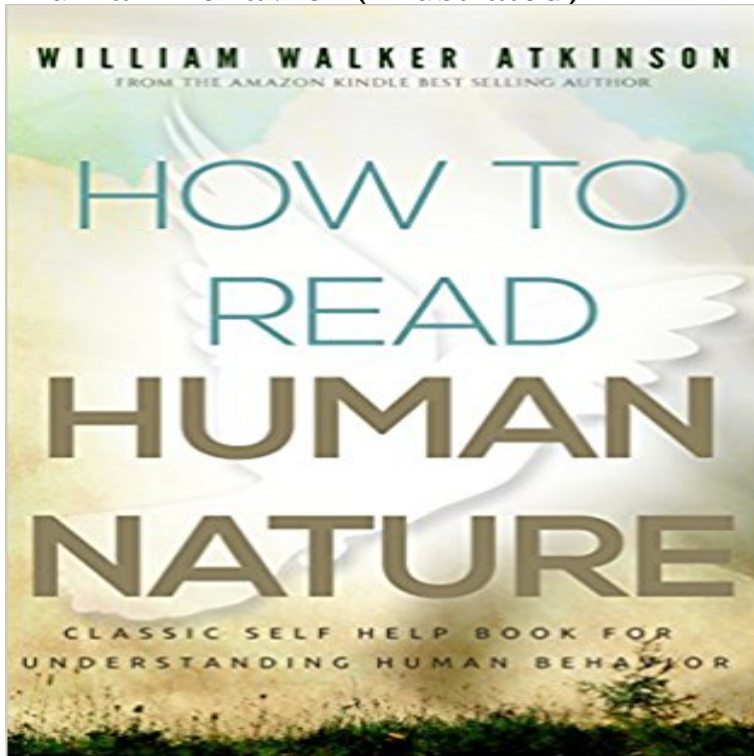


How To Read Human Nature: Classic Self Help Book For Understanding Human Behavior (Illustrated)
