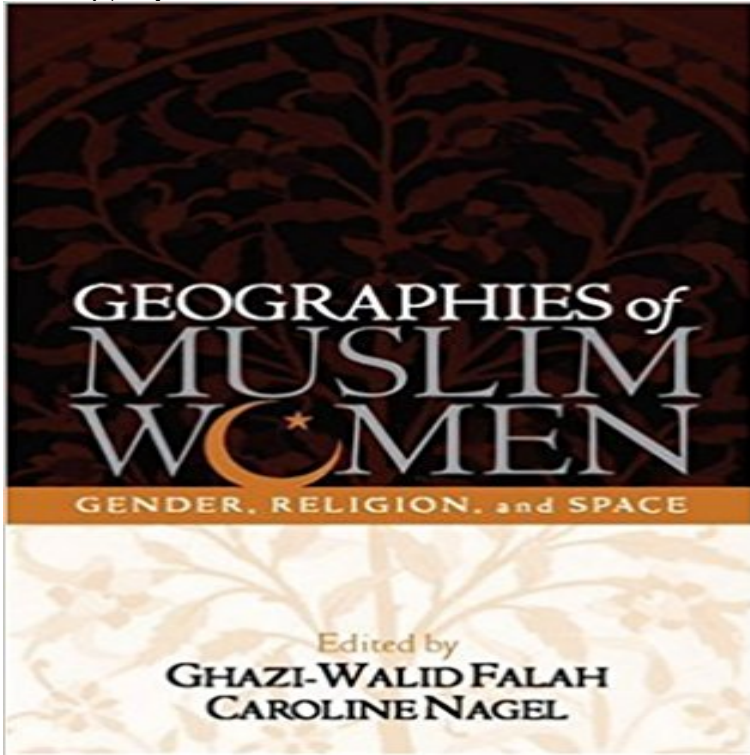


Geographies of Muslim Women: Gender, Religion, and Space
