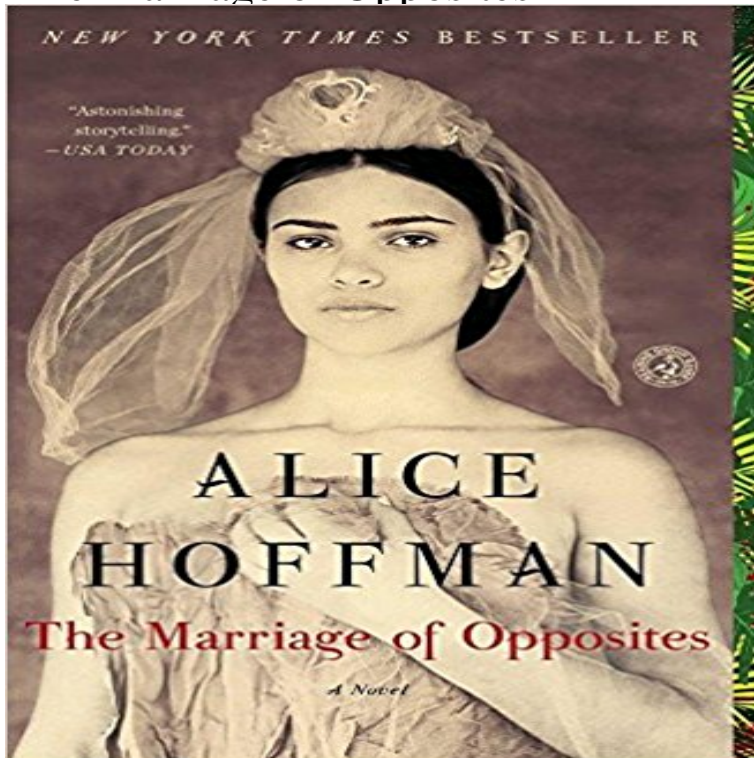


The Marriage of Opposites
