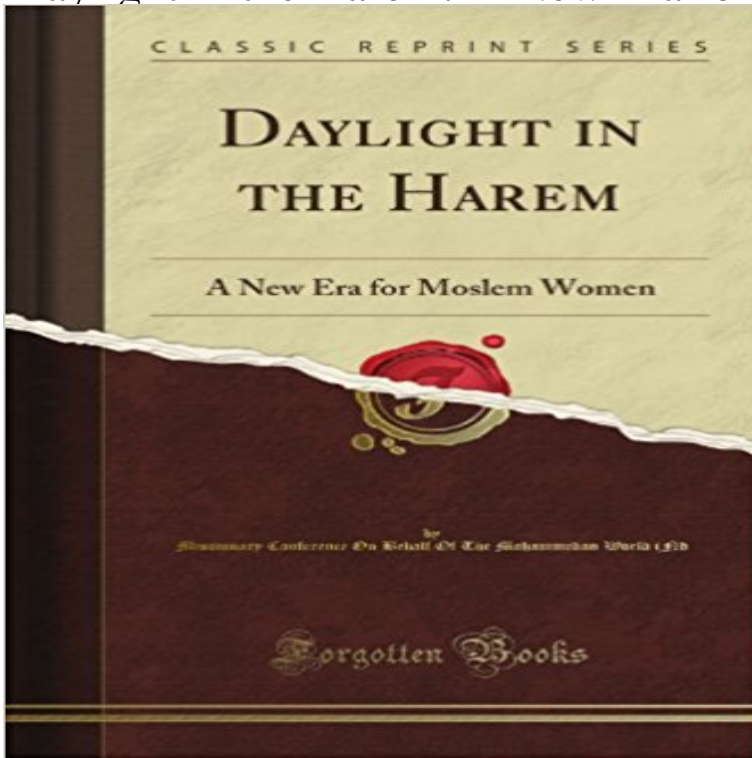


Daylight in the Harem: A New Era for Moslem Women (Classic Reprint)
