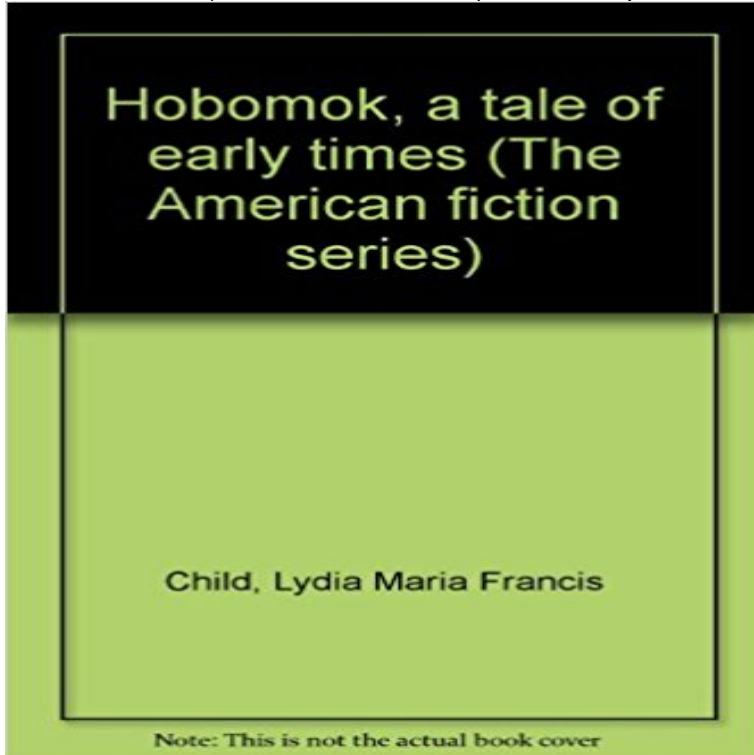


Hobomok, a tale of early times (The American fiction series)
