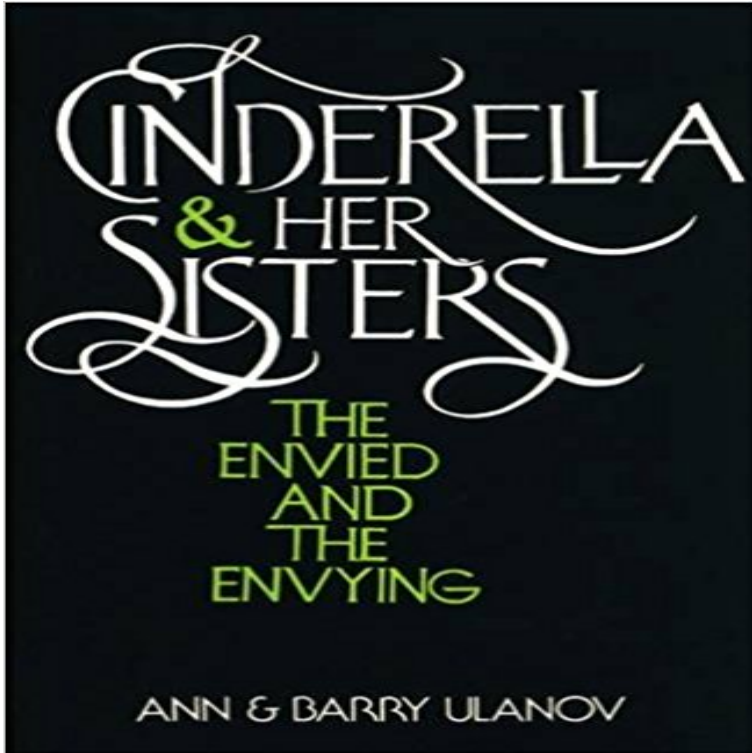


Cinderella and Her Sisters: The Envied and the Envyng
