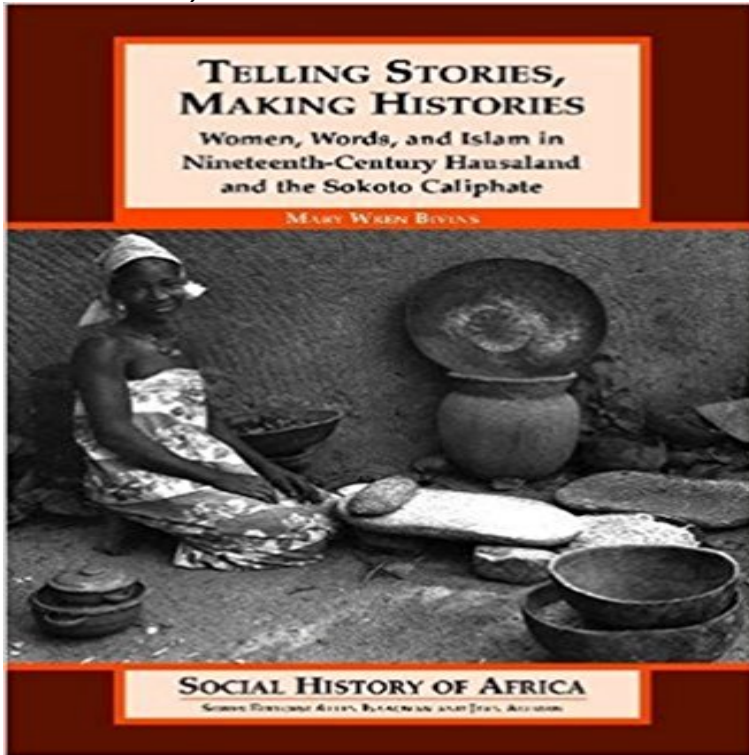


# Telling Stories, Making Histories : Women, Words, and Islam in Nineteenth-century Hausaland and the Sokoto Caliphate (Social History of Africa)

The personal narratives and folk stories reveal the importance of illiterate, non-elite women to the history of jihad and the assimilation of normative Islam in rural Hausaland. The captivating lives of the Hausa are captured, shedding light on their ordinary existence as wives, mothers, and providers for their family on the eve of European colonial conquest.
