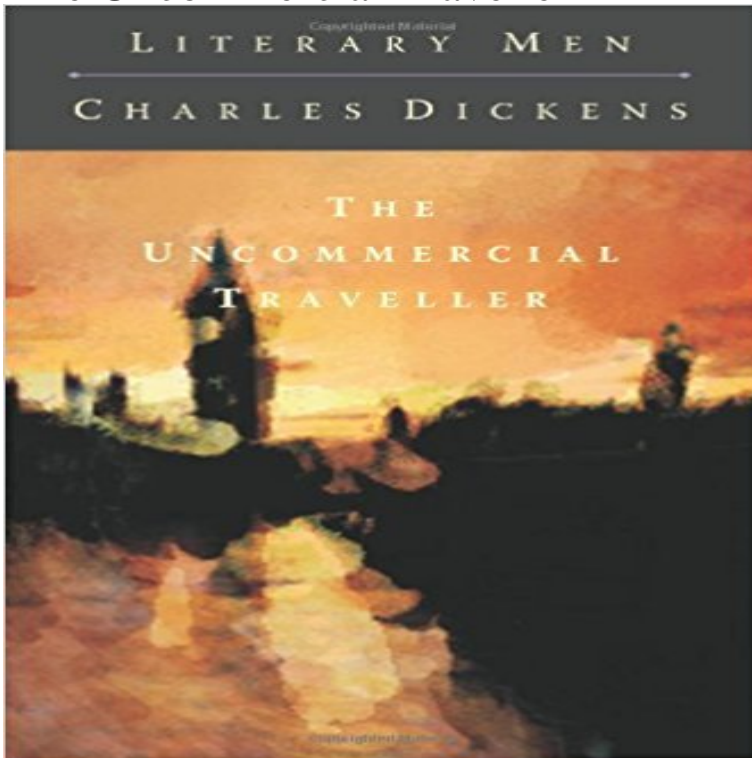


The Uncommercial Traveller



Not content to rest on his laurels, Charles Dickens continued to pursue new ideas and new enterprises long after he had achieved fame and fortune. This collection of literary sketches and reminiscences was written originally for *All the Year Round*, a journal founded by Dickens in 1859. The title and persona of the Uncommercial Traveller resulted from a speech he gave to the Commercial Travellers School London in his role as honorary chairman and treasurer. As a writer who liked to travel, not only as a tourist, but also to research and report what he found, this persona was an excellent fit. While visiting Europe, America and giving book readings throughout Britain, he often suffered from insomnia and his night-time wanderings gave him an insight into some of the hidden aspects of Victorian London, details of which he also incorporated into his novels. These personal sketches, filled with telling detail and arch humor, provide unique insight into life in the late nineteenth century, and into the mind of the man who created stories that endure and fascinate to this day.
