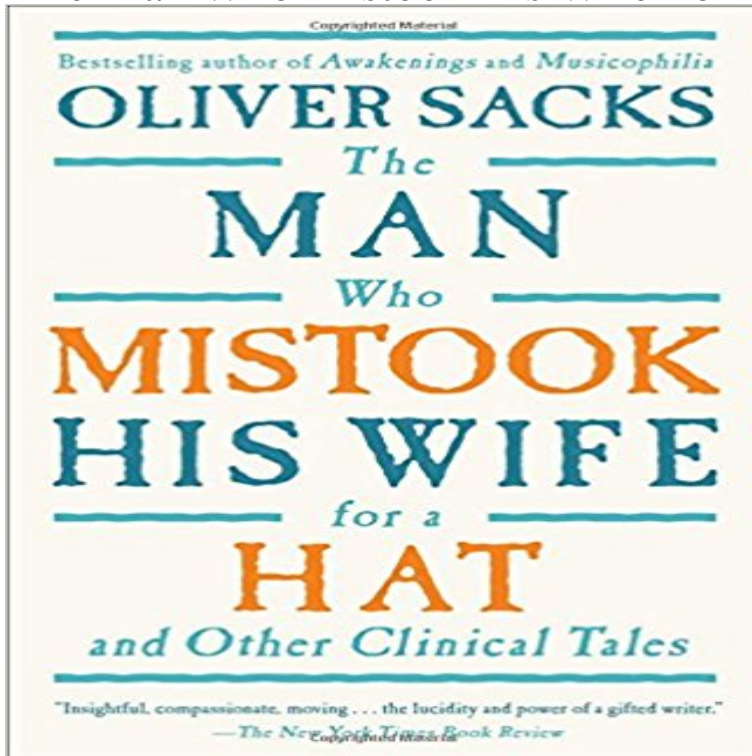


The Man Who Mistook His Wife For A Hat: And Other Clinical Tales
